

Bible Book Cards

Collect the cards and play games with them

The Bible is God's message to us.

The Old Testament tells how God chose Abraham's family, the Jews, to be his special people. God's people didn't always obey him, but God promised that he would send a Savior for everyone.

The New Testament tells how God sent Jesus to be the Savior. Jesus taught us how to live and died on the cross for our sins. After Jesus went back to heaven, his followers told other people about him.

Here are some things you can do with your Bible book cards:

Learn facts about the Bible.

Read the information on the cards to learn about the books of the Bible.

Put all the books in order.

Try to put the books in order without looking at the numbers. Then look at the numbers to check yourself. If you don't know the order, use the numbers to help you.

Divide the books into groups by division.

Sort the cards into piles according to division of the Bible. If you don't know the divisions, use the information on the cards to help you. If you know the divisions, cover up everything but the book name while you sort the cards. Then check yourself by reading the division names on the cards.

Try to answer questions about the Bible books.

Take a Bible book card and cover everything but the name of the book. Choose one of the questions listed below. After you answer the question, look at the card to check your answer. Put the cards you get correct in one pile and the others in another pile. Try to get as many in the correct pile as you can.

Play with a friend and ask each other questions.

Choose a card and ask your friend one of the questions listed below. After your friend answers, check the answer on the card. If the answer is right your friend gets to keep that card. Then your friend asks you a question and checks your answer to see if you get to keep the card. See who can get the most cards.

Here are some questions for the games. You can use the same question for every card or use a different question for each round of the game. You may think of more questions or more ways to play the game.

- Is this book in the Old or New Testament?
- In which division is this book located?
- Which book is right before this book?
- Which book is right after this book?
- Who wrote this book?
