The word “gospel” means “good news.” Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John tell the life story of Jesus – the good news that he came to earth to teach us about God and to die for our sins.

Matthew was one of Jesus’ twelve disciples. **Mark** was John Mark, a cousin of Barnabas described in the book of Acts. **Luke** was a doctor. **John** was a disciple and was probably Jesus’ cousin.


Some stories about Jesus are in all four books, and some are in just one book.

The Birth of Jesus

The story of Jesus’ birth in Bethlehem and visit from the shepherds is found in Luke 2:1-20.

Matthew 2:1-12 tells how the wise men came to visit Jesus later.

Connect the dots for a reminder of how Jesus first came to earth.





Names for Jesus

Draw more bread and fish to show how Jesus made more food.




The Parable of the Lost Sheep

Parables are stories to help us understand God. Jesus told many parables.

Jesus told a story about a shepherd with 100 sheep. When one sheep got lost, he left the other 99 sheep in a safe place and went to find the lost sheep. The shepherd is Jesus, and we are the sheep.

This story is found in Matthew 18 and Luke 15.
