About 1400 B.C. After Moses died, _____ became the leader of the Israelite people. He led them to take over the land that God had promised them.

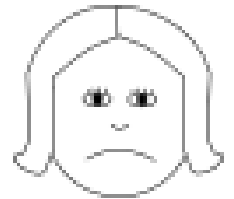
About 1300-1100 B.C. Later God gave the people leaders called judges. Some of them were _____, _____, and _____.

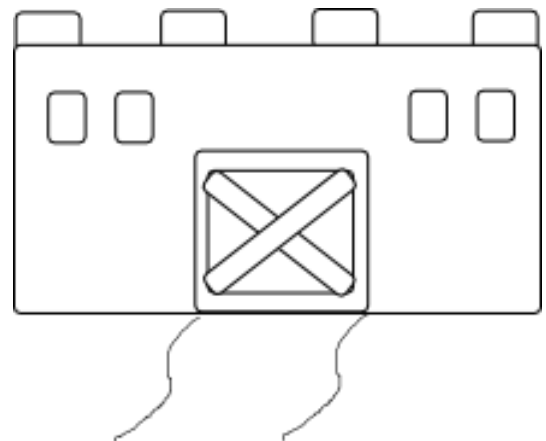
Marching around Jericho

For six days they marched around one time each day. On the seventh day they marched around seven times. Altogether they marched around 13 times!

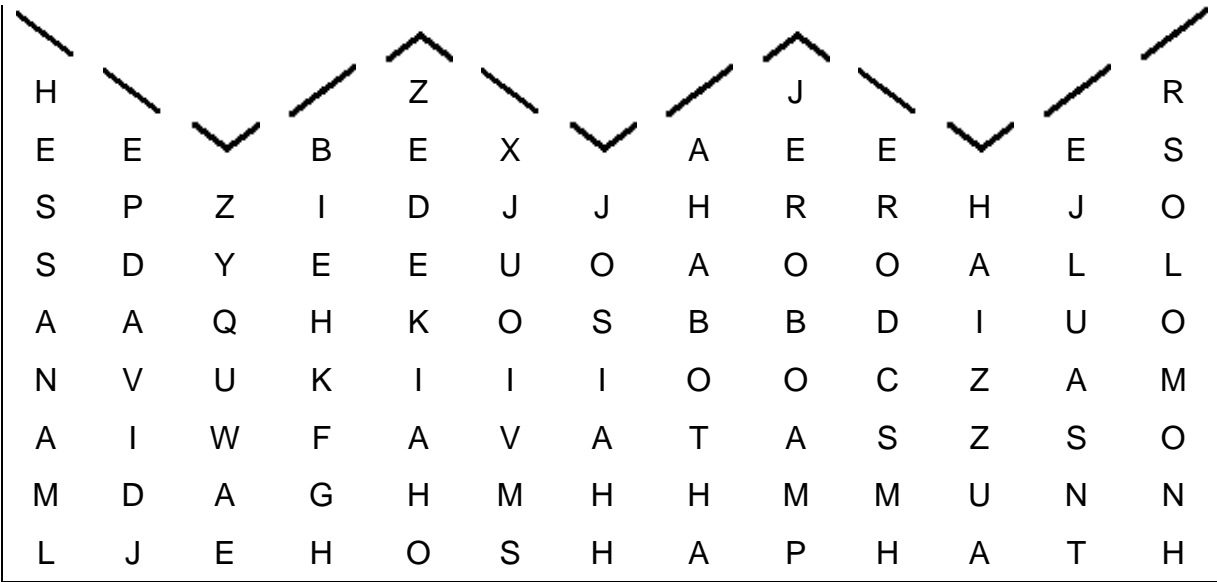
Then they blew trumpets and shouted.
