

The master came back and told the first and second servants, "well done!" But the third servant he kicked out. The third servant tried to make excuses for not doing anything with his talent, but the master did not listen.

God is like the master in the story. He gives his servants, us, different kinds of talents to use to serve him. The Kingdom of Heaven is a place where everyone uses their abilities to glorify God. God rewards us when we serve him in our own special ways, and punishes us when we refuse to use the gifts he has given us to glorify him.

The first servant invested the five bags of money and made five more bags. The second servant also worked with the money and made two more bags. But the third servant was lazy. He just buried the one bag of silver. He didn't even bother to put it in the bank!

Matthew 25:14-30.

"Again, the Kingdom of Heaven can be illustrated by the story of a man going on a long trip. He called together his servants and entrusted his money to them while he was gone. 15 He gave five bags of silver to one, two bags of silver to another, and one bag of silver to the last—dividing it in proportion to their abilities. He then left on his trip.

16 "The servant who received the five bags of silver began to invest the money and earned five more. 17 The servant with two bags of silver also went to work and earned two more. 18 But the servant who received the one bag of silver dug a hole in the ground and hid the master's money. 19 "After a long time their master returned from his trip and called them to give an account of how they had used his money. 20 The servant to whom he had entrusted the five bags of silver came forward with five more and said, 'Master, you gave me five bags of silver to invest, and I have earned five more.' 21 "The master was full of praise. 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. You have been faithful in handling this small amount, so now I will give you many more responsibilities. Let's celebrate together!'

There once was a man who went on a trip and left his three servants in charge of his money. To the first servant he gave five bags of silver. To the second servant he gave two bags of silver and to the third servant he gave one bag of silver. These bags of silver were also called talents.

22 "The servant who had received the two bags of silver came forward and said, 'Master, you gave me two bags of silver to invest, and I have earned two more.' 23 "The master said, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. You have been faithful in handling this small amount, so now I will give you many more responsibilities. Let's celebrate together!'

24 "Then the servant with the one bag of silver came and said, 'Master, I knew you were a harsh man, harvesting crops you didn't plant and gathering crops you didn't cultivate. 25 I was afraid I would lose your money, so I hid it in the earth. Look, here is your money back.' 26 "But the master replied, 'You wicked and lazy servant! If you knew I harvested crops I didn't plant and gathered crops I didn't cultivate, 27 why didn't you deposit my money in the bank? At least I could have gotten some interest on it.' 28 "Then he ordered, 'Take the money from this servant, and give it to the one with the ten bags of silver. 29 To those who use well what they are given, even more will be given, and they will have an abundance. But from those who do nothing, even what little they have will be taken away. 30 Now throw this useless servant into outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'"

God rewards when we use the talents he gives us for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven and punishes us when we don't use them.
